Our recent weekend at church with guest pastor Rev. Daniel Cooperrider, opened up the glories of God's creation in many (pardon the pun) creative ways. Through a workshop, a Sunday sermon, and an outdoor "Wild Church" service in the South Chagrin Reservation, we experienced new ways of understanding how all creatures of the earth, and all non-human living elements such as trees, rivers, clouds and sunshine, and all of the foliage of the earth, are partners in faith with us, given as gifts by God.


The month of May ushers in the lushness of creation that finds its full bloom in the summer months to come. I find this a wonderful metaphor for the life of the church in the months ahead. The greening earth is our teacher, reminding us that fields, mountains, rivers, oceans, woods and gardens are both our playgrounds and our sanctuaries to tend and keep as faithful stewards of the glories of God's unending creativity.

In keeping with the transformative months of Spring into Summer, our worship theme for May and June is "Transformative Encounters," and our theme for the months of July and August is "Metaphors for

God." Within these themes we will explore how both the natural world and the world of the Holy Spirit nudge us into deeper understandings of how God speaks to us, how God loves us, and how God finds us, wherever we are on the journey toward greening and blossoming into all that God created us to be.

Let it be so! Let us sing and pray and worship God together with the playfulness and delight that these seasons herald! In the words of poet Wendell Berry, let us "rest in the grace of the world."

# RePlay Recap:

# Federated Volunteers Adapt Toys So All Can Play

On Saturday, April 15<sup>th</sup>, eighteen Federated volunteers, mostly middle school students and their parents, gathered in Fellowship Hall to rewire toys to help an local organization called RePlay for Kids.

RePlay for Kids, a local nonprofit serving Ohio and beyond, serves to adapt battery-operated toys, attaching developmentally appropriate switches and buttons. Doing so allows all kids, regardless of motor abilities, to be able to play. The toys are also used to teach hand-eye coordination and cause and effect which assists the individual to learn to operate wheelchairs and other support tools in the future.

After a brief introduction from organization staff, the volunteers got to work using directions provided on tablets. The process involved opening the toy, cutting and soldering wires and lots of testing. RePlay provided all the materials needed to complete each project, including the toys. The experience was educational and fun. Most volunteers had never soldered before but enjoyed learning a new skill to help others. Federated is excited to provide this hands-on service opportunity again in the near future.

Thank you to RePlay for Kids for providing a meaningful morning of service!

And special thank you to those who purchased Easter lilies! All proceeds from the 2023 Easter Lily sales were donated to RePlay for Kids. Your generosity helped make the day even more successful.

## Mission & Service

#### **Thea Bowman Center**

The beneficiary of Federated Church's 2022 Christmas Eve Offering of \$20,000 was the **Thea Bowman Center (TBC)** which, since 1966, has been is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life in Cleveland's Mt. Pleasant neighborhood through food support, children's programs, and adult education. The Center is named after Sister Thea Bowman (1937-1990) who was a black Catholic Sister, teacher, liturgist, musician and evangelist.

Thea Bowman Center serves 2500 children each month in the TBC Kids After-school Program held at Nathan Hale Elementary School, operates a Food Pantry delivering groceries to roughly 80 seniors a month in partnership with the Cleveland Food Bank, sponsors a 6-week Summer Youth Camp from June - August, maintains a Community Garden at the corner of 112th Street and Kinsman Road, and holds Adult GED and Literacy classes 4 days a week. Some of the most popular topics in the community education program are computer instruction for senior adults and computer coding for teens. Also popular is the free tax preparation offered in conjunction with the IRS each year from January - April. Last year, TBC helped 500 residents file their taxes at no charge which resulted in roughly \$1M in tax refunds coming back to residents in the neighborhood.

The Mt. Pleasant community was once a vibrant neighborhood with large lovely homes built in the 1930's and 40's. Today, the median household income is \$28,000 and residents of the Mt. Pleasant community have numerous challenges we would find shocking. For instance, no grocery stores, poor internet service, and many abandoned and deteriorating homes which have created safety issues and declining property values.

Federated's funds were a wonderful gift to the Thea Bowman Center and the people they serve. Additionally, there are many other ways the Federated Church family can assist. The Center welcomes our volunteer help in the Adult GED Program, presenting programs for Seniors on health and well-being, or conducting an art, cooking or music education program for the children in the Summer Camp or After-School program.
