# From the Desk of Our Church Moderator...

Dear Congregation,

My warmest thoughts and holiday wishes to each of you and yours! A New Year means a new chapter for each of us and for Federated Church. As we all look forward to 2024, may our community of faith be filled with a spirit of joy, embrace and transformation as we seek to love the world through Jesus Christ.

As was shared in the November Spire, a joint Evaluation Team ratified the Church's management agreement with the Community Life Collaborative (CLC), which terminates on March 31st, 2025. Since this decision, your Church Council has carefully considered the Long-Term strategic value and material financial obligations if the Church were to continue as the owner of the FLC property (16349 Chillicothe Rd).

Your Church Council, guided by Federated's shared purpose, has strategically examined our current physical infrastructure and is confident that our 76 Bell Street main campus is more than adequate and should be the focus of future capital and maintenance investments. Additionally, we considered the FLC property's projected maintenance investment needs over the next several years, which are expected to range from \$500,000 to \$750,000, assuming similar uses to those at present. Furthermore, while our Church is so much more than any single building, we believe that our main campus will continue to be the central gathering place of our dynamic faith community. After careful deliberation, on December 5th, 2023, your Council passed the following proposal regarding the FLC property:

#### Approved Resolution (12/5/23):

Church Council recommends to the congregation for consideration at its 2023 Annual Meeting (2/25/24) the sale of the FLC property, offering the CLC the right of first offer to purchase the FLC property at 90% of fair market value. However, if the CLC is not the purchaser, the new owner will abide by the conditions in the current CLC management agreement through its expiry date (3/31/2025).

# From the Desk of Our Church Moderator...

As the proceeds from an eventual sale of the FLC property will be material to the Church, your Council has directionally aligned on the use of these funds for three strategic purposes:

- 1. Thoughtful and intentional design and construction of a relocated memorial garden on the available property at 76 Bell Street.
- 2. Investment in infrastructure and maintenance projects, and enhancement of the Church's deferred maintenance fund (estimated use of 1/3 of the remaining proceeds).
- 3. Enhancement of the Church's investment funds with the interest generated from these funds to support Federated's mission by fully investing in our VAP Visionary Action Plan.

As we move forward together, your Council will host the following three engagement sessions:

- 1. An in-person Elected Lay Leaders meeting to discuss the recommendation, following worship on Sunday, January 28th 2024. A summary of this meeting will be published in the February Spire.
- 2. An in-person member-only listening session, following worship on Sunday, February 11th 2024.
- 3. A virtual member-only listening session via Zoom at 6pm on Tuesday, February 13th 2024.

Once these sessions have concluded and in accordance with Federated Church's constitution (*see reference below*), a congregational vote will occur at the Church's annual meeting on Sunday, February 25th 2024.

"The following financial transactions require the prior approval by vote of the Church Congregation at a meeting duly called as provided by Article XI: B. Any sale, lease or encumbrance of Church property in an amount greater than \$100,000.

Thank you in advance for thoughtfully and prayerfully considering your Church Council's recommendation on this important decision. I look forward to hearing from you and engaging with you at the upcoming listening sessions.







#### A Look Back Inspires a Look Forward:

In just 3 years time (including COVID), we are humbled by what the Community Life Collaborative has accomplished...

- Getting the FLC operational from being shuttered and unmaintained
- Aligning facility uses with Federated's values while elevating outreach to 300–500 members community members using the FLC every month
- Evolving CLC leadership from a volunteer Executive Director to a part time ED to a full time ED
- Developing a 7-member Board of Directors diverse in expertise and representation
- Implementing frameworks for curating programs and projects among prominent as well as uncommon stakeholders to engage communities across Northeast Ohio
- Amplifying diverse voices and empowering communities historically silenced or dismissed
- Cultivating curiosity around social issues with innovative programming and problem-solving toward a just world

#### As we envision the future of the CLC at the FLC, we continue to ask community-facing questions like:

- What are the dreams of our neighbors in underserved communities?
- How might the FLC space host summits for climate change and youth leadership in response to the next generation's fears for their future?
- How else can the FLC stand at the intersection of community and connection in our region?

#### Upcoming vote on the FLC

In February of 2020, the congregation overwhelmingly chose to support a partnership with the CLC. The CLC is using the FLC in a way that is both financially sustainable and mission-based which the church originally desired. As you have likely read, the church council is recommending the sale of the FLC property. Both the CLC and Federated Church are made stronger by our partnership. We hope for continued support from the congregation so that the CLC can operate as a burgeoning asset of community engagement and mission outreach.

The <u>Community Life Collaborative</u> manages all operations and covers repair & improvement costs of the FLC for Federated.
