From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton Throckmorton...

Dear Friends,

Last month in this space, I had the pleasure of giving thanks for the work of Melissa Owen, our recently-departed Senior Director of People and Operations (SDPO). This month, I have the joy of celebrating the arrival of our two most recently-engaged staff members.

Into the role of SDPO steps Beth Rutkowski. Beth has, for a year, been on the staff of Federated as our Director of Generosity. Working closely with Melissa, she took on that position with gusto, initiating many contacts in the community and, in a full-time role, broadening the work that Laura Taylor, in a part-time role, had so ably begun. Having served several years earlier as moderator of Federated, and having willingly extended her term by a year during the COVID pandemic, Beth is extremely familiar with the church and its staff and procedures, and is deeply committed to the church's life and mission. She's the ideal person to assume the position of SDPO, and has stepped into it with vigor and creativity. We are extremely blessed to have her in that role.

On June 3, Thea Mozingo will take over the role of Director of Generosity. A longtime member of the church, Thea has been involved for many years. This is, in fact, not Thea's first role on the church staff. A number of years ago, she served in an interim capacity in our children's ministry department. She has an instinctive understanding of the role of giving in the church, and will contribute wonderfully to deepening our sense of the importance of generosity. I couldn't be happier than to have Thea as our new Director of Generosity.

Both Beth and Thea understand what it's like to work for non-profits, having worked in that world for many years. And they are both animated by a deep and abiding faith honed by a lifetime of engagement with the church.

During this time of transition for the church, and as I prepare to retire, Federated is deeply blessed to have people of such rich ability and faithfulness step into these crucial positions. Please greet them when you see them and let them know how grateful we are for their service to God and Federated.

Dear Members and Friends of Federated Church,

I write to let you know that, after much reflection and prayer, I have decided to retire from Federated Church and from full-time pastoral ministry. My last Sunday in the pulpit will be October 27, 2024, and my retirement will be effective November 1, 2024.

After more than 37 years in the ministry, I am ready to assume a different pace to life. Mary and I look forward to doing some traveling and to having the chance to visit with family and friends. I anticipate opportunities to contribute to, and to enjoy, life in new, and as yet unimagined, ways. It's a time, for me, of open-ended promise.

At the same time, though, retirement will be, for me, an event of notable loss and of palpable grief. When I began my ministry here in November of 2004, I could hardly have imagined the graces that awaited me. I have experienced unsurpassed joy in the ministry. The opportunity to partner with you in the gospel has been extraordinarily rewarding. You and I have shared major life events, including illnesses and divorces and deaths and births and baptisms and weddings. We have together opened ourselves to God's presence, guidance, and peace. We have sought to discern direction for the church, for ourselves, for each other, and for the world. We have wrestled together with manifold challenges. We have shared times of both desolation and elation. It has been the joy and privilege of a lifetime for me to have served as your pastor for these last 20 years, and for us to have served God together. "Thank you" hardly seems adequate for that incredibly rich grace.

After my retirement, Mary and I plan to continue to live in our current home in South Russell. And while that means I may see you around town, it is also important for me to remind us all that, effective with my retirement, and in accordance with the practices of retiring United Church of Christ pastors, I will no longer be performing the public functions of ministry at Federated and with church members. I will absent myself from the church. And I will no longer be performing baptisms, weddings, and memorial services for church members. And while that separation may strike some as harsh, it is the larger church's way of assuring that you establish a bond with the new pastor who will follow.

Federated Church is a remarkable place. You will now move to a new chapter in your common life, and I am convinced that it will be a chapter that is full of grace. My prayer is that you will lean into that and look excitedly toward the future that is to come.

I will miss you more than I can say. And at the same time, I trust that God will go with us all into the new vistas that await us. May God hold us all close in this tender transitional time.

Dear Members of Federated Church,

I know the news of Hamilton's retirement is a shock to all of you. Like all retirement announcements, we're incredibly happy that he can spend time with his family and gently lay down the burden of pastor life that he's carried for so long. We're sad for all of us, he's done an amazing job leading Federated for twenty years and we have a hard time imagining the next leader. But as with all challenges that come to us, God is with us through this journey.

First, a thank you to Hamilton. You've been a beacon of light, a compassionate leader, a powerful educator and an inspiration to us all. You've done the good work of the Lord in our lives and left us better for it. As you spend time relaxing, traveling, laughing and walking around the neighborhood, rest easy that you did an amazing job. You're leaving a congregation that is extremely grateful for all you've done for us.

Hamilton's retirement will be effective November 1, 2024. The council is working closely with the UCC denomination team to find an interim pastor for a 12 month term. After November 1, all church inquiries and needs should be directed to the new pastor or the church office.

Finding a new pastor is a serious undertaking. We'll be forming a pastoral transition committee that will work to carefully understand and document the needs of the church and lead up to the beginning of the search process. Jeff Miller, Vice Moderator, will be leading the interview process for the interim pastor and also leading that transition team. The transition team will work through the summer, leading up to a formal search committee that will be elected and approved by the entire church body in the fall.

Hamilton, we want to express our deepest gratitude for your selfless service. Your dedication, wisdom, and love have left an indelible mark on our hearts. As you step into this new chapter of your life, know that you carry our blessings, love and prayers with you.

As we prepare for this transition, let us come together in prayer, celebrating the legacy Hamilton leaves and eagerly anticipating the next chapter for our congregation.

May God's grace continue to guide us as we move forward.

First, for the Senior Director of People and Operations, we're happy that Beth Rutkowski accepted the position and is in full stride already. Beth was serving as the Director of Generosity, and it was great to be able to promote her to this important role. Beth is now responsible for the management of the church staff, along with the facility operations, service planning and day-to-day finance. Backfilling Beth's Generosity role, we were able to hire one of our amazing congregation members, Thea Mozingo. Thea has embraced the Director of Generosity position and will be working on outreach and generosity programs.

Since Hamilton's retirement announcement, we've been working through the process of recruiting an interim pastor. That work is being led by Jeff Miller, our Vice Moderator. Hamilton's last day will be October 31st and the interim pastor will start serving on November 1 for a one-year term. In the fall, we'll be forming up the official pastoral search committee and begin the process of understanding the church pastoral requirements.

In the meantime, our church is strong and continues our programs of growth. The Memorial Day weekend service at the Family Life Center was beautiful, with a great LBGTQ+ dance there still to come.

Notes on the concert:



ChamberFest Cleveland is pleased to present its first performance in the beautiful Federated Church in Chagrin Falls. The excellent acoustics and welcoming atmosphere will make this a musical evening to remember.

Among the impressive roster of visiting artists, soprano **Susanna Phillips** makes her ChamberFest debut in 2024. This acclaimed artist has appeared in leading roles at The Metropolitan Opera, as well as frequent performances as a soloist with numerous orchestras across the country. Her talents will be on display in the evocative *Hermit Songs* by Samuel Barber, with texts based on a collection of anonymous poems written

by Irish monks and scholars from the 8th to 13th centuries.

Also featured in this concert is trumpeter **Brandon Ridenour**, an artist known for both his talent as a performer and as an arranger. Both skills take the stage with his intimate arrangements of Vivaldi arias and Beatles songs for trumpet and string quartet, charming audiences with the heart-felt sentiment and delicate treatment of these popular melodies.



Works by beloved French composers Maurice Ravel and Camille Saint-Saëns round out this eclectic program. This year marks the ChamberFest debut of violinist **Tai Murray**, who will be featured in Ravel’s exquisite sonata. Drawing inspiration from American Jazz and Blues, Ravel reflects musical styles that captivated French audiences in the 1920s. Saint-Saëns’s exciting Septet provides a strong ending to this program, with the unusual instrumentation of trumpet, string quintet, and piano.

Since 2012, ChamberFest Cleveland has presented acclaimed national and international chamber music specialists in concerts at an eclectic array of venues in the Greater Cleveland area. This summer, Season 12: SACRED + PROFANE (June 12 – 29, 2024) continues the tradition with twelve concerts of inquisitive introspection and joyous celebration.

'23-'24 Performing Arts Series Season Recap from the desk of Joshua Konow

The 2023-2024 Performing Arts Series season is now complete. This was our most ambitious season yet, encompassing seven concerts. Since our 2018 sanctuary renovation, Federated has become a sought-after venue for the performing arts. The series is a true passion project of mine and I'm thrilled to see it grow more each year. There is much to be excited about as we move forward, but let's take a moment to reflect on this past season.

We are thrilled to have become a preferred venue for Apollo's Fire. This season featured three co-present concerts with them: "Splendour in London", "Wassail" and "Bach's Easter Oratorio." These programs universally sell out, but a reminder that any Apollo's Fire concert at Federated Church comes with 100 tickets made available for us to sell! These are often some of the best remaining seats closer to the concert date. "Wassail", for example, sold out a *month* before the concert! We added 40 extra seats for a thrilling Christmas-themed evening.

A special highlight this season was celebrating Marcia Snavelly's 30 years as Organist at Federated Church! We were joined by the Federated Choir, soloists, and the Chagrin Falls Studio Orchestra conducted by Steve Eva and me. It was a very joyous evening where Marcia got to play a bucket-list piece: the Finale from Saint-Saens "Organ Symphony". The choir also rollicked some spiritual arrangements by John Rutter. We are all incredibly grateful for Marcia's talents and grace as an organist!

Spring was a busy time for our series. I was completely honored to perform alongside soprano Sonya Headlam highlighting works by black composers. She has an incomparable stage presence and ability to tell a story through her sound. It was an unforgettable experience! Shortly afterwards, we did a total 180 for the Cleveland Celtic Ensemble and Irish-themed dinner. I'm so grateful to the many volunteers that helped cook, clean, and usher for all our events! I enjoyed dressed up in Irish-regale and the evening was very festive!

We concluded our season with the Factory Seconds Brass trio: all members of the Cleveland Orchestra! Their sound is at an unbelievably prominent level of mastery. Totally unprompted, trombonist Rick Stout said during the program to the audience, "Federated has become our preferred place to record because of the wonderful acoustics, and the people are so nice!". We are blessed as a church to have such a phenomenal facility!

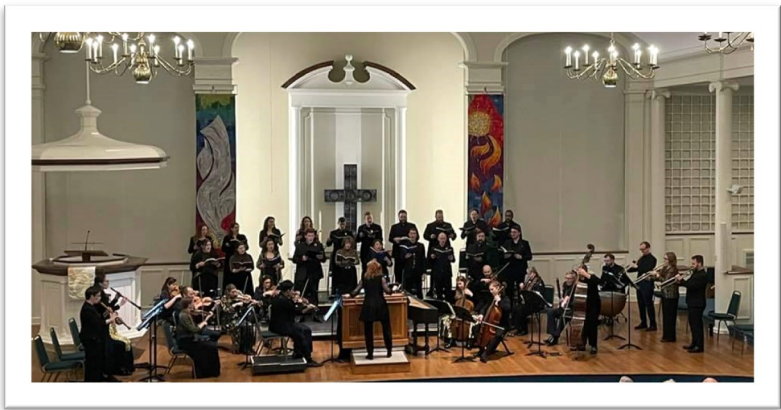
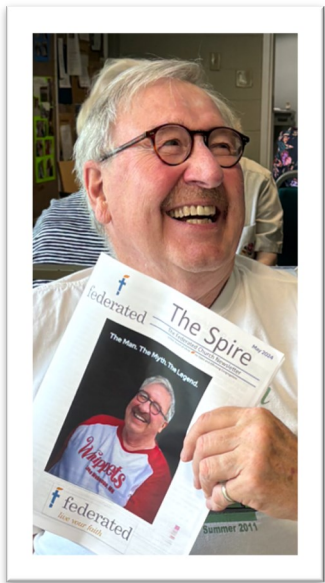

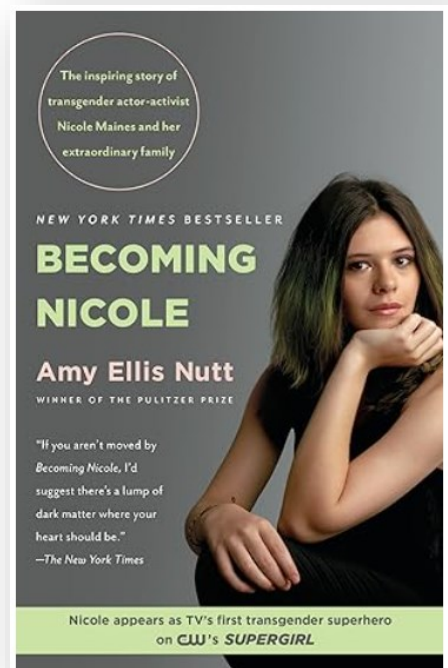

Relationships are key. Widely acclaimed public interest lawyer, Bryan Stevenson, emphasizes the **Power of Proximity**. He asserts that *when we deliberately engage, invest, and situate ourselves beside people who are ignored, excluded, or marginalized we create a healthier environment where no one feels invisible or disfavored*.

In May, volunteers of all ages worked together in the East Cleveland community gardens to prepare soil and plant vegetables. There, **neighborhood food ambassadors** help increase food security at home. Later, a collaboration of leaders from Food Strong (Cleveland) and The Big Love Network (Akron) described two distinct models and processes for mobilizing resources to make a difference. And collaborations continue to expand!

Meanwhile, the Family Life Center offered wide open spaces for kids to be immersed in nature. Swinging vines, nature crafts, and scavenger hunts ignited **new experiences in the great outdoors!**

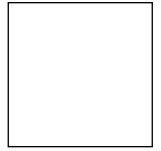
