From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton...

Dear Friends,

As we enter this fall season, with Rally Day approaching on September 8, I am excited to embark on a new program year and its attendant promise. Federated Church is a congregation of such energy and hope and enthusiasm. New programs pop up. Fresh ideas are brewing. Over these last nearly two centuries, Federated has weathered storms, confronted challenges, and, again and again, found fresh vitality. The energy and resilience of this congregation have been unsurpassed. It's a remarkable and God-given gift.

At the same time, as I approach my retirement and my last Sunday on October 27, I am also extremely aware of the "lasts" in our partnership here. I will soon celebrate my last communion and baptisms with you. Several memorial services approach, with perhaps one or two to be added. Concluding Council and commission meetings await. I've already officiated at my final Christmas Eve and Easter services. And earlier this summer, two different families, who were soon to move away, set aside time for us to be able to say goodbye, a gesture for which I was and am extremely grateful.

My hope in our last two months together is that we do the good and necessary work of saying goodbye well. When people are dying, it is said that there are five major tasks in which to engage: saying I'm sorry for the things we've done wrong; offering forgiveness for the ways we've been hurt; expressing genuine thanks; telling people we love them; and saying goodbye.

And while my retirement is certainly not a death, it is the end of a long and, from my angle, joyful and grace-filled relationship. And when such relationships end, it seems crucial to express what needs to be said. The hope is that no hard feelings linger and that the joy of the relationship is given space in which to be expressed.

So rather than leave important matters unspoken, I invite you to speak with me, or to set up a breakfast or lunch together. I'd love to explore with you any lingering or new spiritual or theological questions you may have; to talk about the church; to reflect on God's presence in your life; to mend fences if need be; to grieve—never underestimate the value of a good cry!; or to celebrate. Or any combination of these!

I suspect it goes without saying, but I will say it anyway: these have been rich and vibrant years for me, and, in order to move on to the new horizons that await both you and me, I want to make sure we pause now to mark the moment.

Thanks be to God for the blessing of these years, and for the opportunity to say our healthy goodbyes. It's all an immense gift and privilege!

From the Desk of Operations...

It's been a busy summer around 76 Bell Street! Along with the ongoing maintenance, we've taken the time to work on some exciting projects and have several more in the works. Here's a brief summary:

- Cleaned out the Media Closet for TNT storage
- Cleaned out Room 320 for Handbells and other music items
- Moved unused office furniture out of the old CE Office to the lower level
- Prepared G10 and G20 (lower level rooms) to be offered for office rental space and co-working rental space – Will launch this fall!
- Turned the old CE Office space into a new YOUTH ROOM! Opening soon!
- Installed new phone system and new security cameras
- Will begin renovation of the Lounge this fall
- Will repair old water damage in Room 320 and paint this fall
- Will install new HVAC unit for classroom/office/tower buildings this fall



Also, BIG thanks to volunteer Gary Dole who is reorganizing and consolidating all the choir and bell music. It's a big job!

We have so much to be grateful for! We believe that the people are the church, but the building is the place that hosts and houses us, keeps us warm and cool, and provides space to come together as the family of God. Loving care of this place shows our care for each other and our community.

This fall will launch the search for a new Senior Pastor for Federated Church. The plan is to have a full-time, settled Senior Pastor in place following the one-year interim period which will begin upon Hamilton's retirement. There is currently a small interim committee, appointed by the Church Council, interviewing potential interim pastors and developing criteria for members of the Senior Pastor Search Committee. These members will be approved by a vote of the congregation, which takes place at a special called meeting. The process will follow this timeline:

September 3: Interim committee presents Senior Pastor Search Committee criteria to Church Council

September 1 – 30: Church Council accepts nominations for members of the Senior Pastor Search Committee from congregation and Church Council

October 1: Church Council approves a slate of names for the Senior Pastor Search Committee

October 6: Special Called Meeting of the Congregation to approve the slate of names for the Senior Pastor Search Committee

Creation Tip of the Month:

Getting Plastic Out of Food

Our food travels a complex path to our dinner tables, which increases the risk of contamination from substances that shouldn't be there. Among these are plasticizers, chemicals used to make plastics more flexible and durable. The most common type of plasticizers, called phthalates, can be found inside the bodies of most Americans and have been linked to a growing list of health risks.

CR has been reporting on plasticizers in food for decades. Our most recent testing examined 85 packaged products, including fast foods and organic foods, and found phthalates in nearly every one. The product with the highest level per serving was Annie's cheese ravioli.

This is concerning partly because Annie's, which is owned by food giant General Mills, is an organic food brand that promotes itself to families seeking healthier food options. But four other General Mills products that we tested—Yoplait Original Low Fat Yogurt French Vanilla, Cheerios Original, Green Giant Cream Style Sweet Corn, and Progresso Vegetable Classics Vegetable Soup—also contained relatively high levels of phthalates. So CR wrote the company, urging it to determine where plasticizers are entering its production chains and to take steps to reduce exposure. In May we delivered some 30,000 consumer signatures demanding

99% of the food and drinks CR tested

contained phthalates.

this action to General Mills' Minneapolis headquarters.

- Community guests walk the labyrinth and gardens and visit family memorial stones in memory and prayer.




