

From the Desk of Rev. Hamilton...

Dear Friends.

As I prepare to retire at the end of this month, with my last Sunday on October 27, I anticipate this time of saying goodbye with such mixed feelings. I have such immense gratitude for you, the people of Federated Church. There will be other opportunities in coming weeks for me to say what's most on my heart and mind. For this moment, let me say simply: Thank you!

One of the dimensions of my retirement that people mention most to me is their occasional befuddlement about the need for me to separate myself from Federated. I write this having just come from a conversation with a colleague of mine at a nearby church who is also retiring this fall. We both lamented the pain of the separation, and at the same time affirmed its need. In removing ourselves from the life of the churches we've served, we will be doing what needs to be done in order for our successors to establish their own relationships with you. In the same way that you didn't know me at all when I arrived in Chagrin Falls, and yet we have developed deep and loving bonds, so I need to leave so you can do the same with my successor.


What will undoubtedly strain me, and may strain you, as well, is that that separation is in no way a forgetting of you or a falling out of love with you. On first glance, that separation may seem cold and unfeeling—"Why doesn't he call me when my mother is on death's door? Why doesn't he show up at my spouse's memorial service?" I can imagine some of you may react that way. What you should know, though, is: I will always love you for the people and church that you are; you have a place in my heart that will never be usurped.

It is also true, though, that, in accordance with tradition and the minister's code of ethics, it is vital that former pastors truly leave their congregations and not be involved in the worship or pastoral care of the church in any way. Cold and unfeeling though it may at first seem, I will not be attending worship services, nor memorial services, nor weddings of church members and friends. Nor will I be engaged in the pastoral care that has connected you and me in a variety of ways. Not because I don't care—the truth is I very much do care—but because for the ministry of the church to thrive, one pastor must leave so another may come. I will say it again: this is not because I don't love you the truth is I love you very much. I leave because I love the church and its ministry too much to interfere with your relationship with your next pastor.

When my predecessor, Dave Norling, left Federated, he made a clean break. His departure let me become your pastor. He humorously begged the church, saying something like, "If you love me, if you ever loved me, if there's even a smidgen of a possibility that you might love me, do not ask me to engage in pastoral activity with you." I am asking the same thing. I trust that, if there's a part of us that doesn't fully understand the reasons now, it will someday become clear.

Thanks be to God for Federated Church, for its many ministries, and for all that it is and will be!

From the Desk of Operations...

This fall has launched the search for a new Senior Pastor for Federated Church. The plan is to have a full-time, settled Senior Pastor in place following the one-year interim period which will begin upon Hamilton's retirement. The Transition Committee, appointed by the Church Council, has interviewed candidates for the Interim Pastor position and is nearing a decision. They have also developed criteria for members of the Senior Pastor Search Committee and have accepted nominations from the congregation throughout the month of September. The full list of nominees and recommended slate will be shared with the Church Council at its October meeting, and the Council will bring a recommendation to the congregation at a Special Called Congregational meeting on Sunday, October 6. A verbal vote of the congregation will approve the slate. The following timeline outlines the upcoming activities:

October 1: Church Council is presented with a slate of names for the Senior Pastor Search Committee; will vote to recommend slate to the Congregation

October 6: Special Called Meeting of the Congregation to approve the criteria and slate of names for the Senior Pastor Search Committee

November 1: Interim Pastor begins one-year Ministry Covenant at Federated

November – June: Search Committee works to discern God's call for the new Senior Pastor of Federated



Livestream Upgrades

Over the last month, you may have noticed changes and upgrades to our livestream experience. It has been a work in progress, but our aim is to noticeably improve the online audio and video. Improvements have included much higher camera resolution and better white balance resulting in a crisper picture with less washout. Our livestream sound is more balanced, fuller sound, and includes a closer feel to "live" like being in worship at the church. As of the service on September 29th, a recurring static issue has been resolved!

CLEANUP BUCKET LIST

Hurricanes, floods and other disasters are happening more frequently. When our neighbors around the world experience these unforeseen circumstances, you can make the road to recovery easier with CWS Cleanup Buckets. These buckets are full of essential home recovery supplies that are needed after a disaster strikes.

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- One 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid (If reused, please scrub clean, Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid. Advertisement on the outside acceptable.)
- One 4-8 oz pump spray air freshener
- ☐ Five scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.)
- Seven sponges, including one large
- One scrub brush (With or without handle.)
- 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose dry cleaning towels (No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels. Remove from packaging.)
- One 32-64 oz or two 25 oz bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent
- One 16-34 oz bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap
- One 12-40 oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (No spray bottles.)
- ☐ One package of 36-50 clothespins
- One 50-100 ft clothesline (Cotton or plastic line.)
- Five dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)
- Two pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (Latex-free, non-surgical. Durable for multiple-use. Remove from packaging.)
- One pair of work gloves (Cotton with leather palm or all leather.)
- 20-28 heavy duty or contractor type 30-45-gallon trash bags on a roll (Remove from packaging.)
- One 6-9 oz bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent (Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes also acceptable.)

All cleaning items must be new and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape.

October: Focus on the Children Month

SJAM invites you to faithfully learn about, pray about and possibly take action on social justice issues affecting our children and youth. Below is information on relevant issues, a focus for each week in October.

Week 1: Gun Violence. Gun deaths among US kids increased 50% between 2019 and 2021 In 2021, 46% of all gun deaths among children and teens involved Black victims; 14% of the US under-18 population was Black in 2021. (Pew Research Center).

Week2: Lead Poisoning. 2.9 in 100 Ohio Children have tested with elevated blood lead levels (EBLLs). Lead is a neurotoxin that damages children's brains and bodies and can be destructive to neurological, cognitive and social-emotional abilities. (ohleadfreekids.org)

Resources: <u>ohleadfreekids.org</u>; American Academy of Pediatrics- ohioapp.org; The Center for Community Solutions- community solutions.com

Week 3: Poverty. In Ohio, In 2020, 16.6% of children were living in poverty (Children's Defense Fund). 26% of Ohio's children have parents who lack secure employment (The Anne E. Casey Foundation).

Resources: The Anne E. Casey Foundation- <u>aecf.org</u>; Ohio Poverty law Center; The Center on Poverty and Community Development, MSASS, Case Western Reserve University

Week 4: Mental Health. 7 in 10 youth in Ohio juvenile justice systems have mental health problems. 5 in 8 Ohioans age 12-17 who have depression did not receive any mental health care. (NAMI Ohio). Ohio is among 41 states with a severe shortage of child psychiatrists, therapists or social workers (American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry).


