

In the Interim...

God speaks in the silence of the heart. Listening is the beginning of prayer. – Mother Teresa

Dear Friends,

"Don't cry!" These were words my mother, who spent her life trying to pretend that everything was fine even when it wasn't, repeated often as I was growing up. It's not that my mom wasn't compassionate; she was. It's just that she was obsessed with keeping everything upbeat and cheerful. It's not that her life was always so cheerful; it wasn't. But as one given to extreme moods, she was an expert at creating false bravado. And as her children, my sisters and I were expected to follow in mother's footsteps and find a way to smile through most struggles. "It will be okay," my mother always assured us, many times in the face of overwhelming evidence that, indeed, it would certainly not be okay.

Perhaps it is in response to my childhood of forced cheeriness that makes Lent one of my favorite seasons of the liturgical year. I welcome the invitation the season offers to slow down, get quiet, and explore the dark corners of our lives where we have the chance listen more closely for God's presence.

As one who lives life in the cacophony and chaos of our 21st century world, I am drawn like a moth to flame for the chance to slow down, to examine and reflect. And I'm guessing that even if you grew up without a smiling façade in your childhood home, I am not alone in my desire for a chance of quiet contemplation. Throughout the season, we will spend extra time in worship slowing ourselves down, appreciating silence and exploring a variety of prayer forms including reflecting in journals, reaffirming our baptismal vows, and praying with a finger labyrinth.

But our chance to listen for God won't be limited to worship. Look for more information about these opportunities in this month's *Spire*.

- Each Sunday morning, you are invited to the chapel at 9:15 for a time of centering prayer that will deepen your worship experience.
- Throughout the season, you will have a chance to participate in an engaging discussion of "The
 Last Week: What the Gospels Really Teach about Jesus' Last Week in Jerusalem." This excellent
 book by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan tells the story, day by day, of the confrontations that led to the killing of Jesus.
- Join Kristin LeFeber for one of three sessions of group spiritual direction to deepen your relationship with the Divine.

May this season of Lent be for each of you a rich journey in faith that deepens your connection to the Holy and makes your resurrection joy complete.

Federated Creation Justice Covenant

On April 21, 2024, Federated Church accepted the covenant and designation of becoming a Creation Justice Church. Federated was awarded this designation by the UCC for its commitment to the ongoing stewardship of God's creation and the resolution to continue to work to heal the earth and its people. In honor of this recognition, we add this covenant to our statements of faith:

Federated Church Creation Justice Covenant

We, the people of the Federated Church, declare our sacred connection to God, each other and the world around us. In response to God's call to be stewards of God's creation, we commit ourselves as individuals and as a congregation to responsibly care for creation and seek justice for those unjustly and unequally affected by human abuses of creations.

With collective resolve, we covenant to continuously promote awareness, advocacy, and action to heal, renew and protect the Earth and its people and demonstrate our covenant in all that we do.

With courage, hope and joy, trusting God's spirit to empower us, we promise to keep Creation Care and Justice at the forefront of all our conversations, policies, practices and decisions and build it into the fabric of our church.

(This statement and the recognition of the new Creation Justice designation was inadvertently omitted from the 2024 Annual Report.)

Lenten Reflections: 40 Days of Recommitting to Creation Care as a Spiritual Practice

What does Creation Care have to do with Lent?

We are entering the 40 days of Lent.

Lent is a time of deep reflection and of shifting from living on autopilot to practicing mindfulness in ways that deepen our connection to God. We take on different spiritual practices such as a new approach to prayer, personal reflections, stretching our generosity, spiritual study & discussions to create or enhance relationships with one another.



CREATION JUSTICE CHURCHES

Committing to creation care is also a form of spiritual practice. Does your faith journey include thinking about leaving a healthy and safe world for future generations?

This year, Easter falls close to Earth Day, an international day to recommit to care for the earth. It is a perfect time to invite our whole congregation to commit to creation stewardship as a spiritual practice. During this period of Lent, we invite everyone to reflect upon a habit or take on a new practice to support God's creation. Dedicating these 40 days to actively appreciating and stewarding the fragility of nature will restore an intentional commitment to future generations, to endangered species, and to our call to ensure the health and unity of the planet and all living beings. What might you do during the 40 days of lent to begin or enhance our spiritual practices to move us towards "right relationship" with the Earth and All God's people and creatures?

How will we do this?

Creation Care as a spiritual practice means we will prayerfully reflect on current habits and practices and consider ways to change, add or interrupt routines that are harmful to God's creation. What habits, practices and ways of living can we begin or expand that will help the earth thrive?



Throughout Lent, there will be a *Creation Care Commitment Tree* in the Fellowship Hall. The Federated Church invites each member, family, or group to visit that tree. You will find there, a paper "leaf". Please take one or two and write on it, describing a habit or practice that you will commit to for the 40 days. We, as a congregation, will add the "leaves" to the tree, naming the specific commitments we are making to support and care for God's Creation.

Select a leaf, sign your name, and let's fill the tree with renewed commitment. Let this be part of a collective spiritual practice and faith journey!




